### **Hearing:**

Cynthia Cushner- I am to back-up what the other people in our community came forward and stated. During the school year there has been numerous times when my yard has been vandalized with litter and I have had to speak to the superintendent on three different occasions to either get the students to come over and pick up their mess or to a teacher come over. I also asked him on two different occasions why are their people parking where we park when there is ample parking at the system. He said this is a town and students can park wherever they want to park. I have had my tires flattened and twice I had to get new tires. The language that is used by these children coming out of school is unbelievable. There has been so much garbage on my lawn. It is disgusting to put up with

this. As a community we were here once before and very accepting to the resolution that was proposed but that resolution isn't working either. Something needs to be done and it is sad that this has to go on.

Mayor DiNardo- This should resolve the parking issue so you should not have any cars there when school is in session.

Attorney Cucchiaro- Mr. Pino and I also met with the Superintendent and School Business Administrator and we relayed in great detail the concerns that the residents have with students parking there. We did here some of what you had heard where people can park wherever they want. Our answer to that was not anymore because we now have an ordinance. Our purpose there was to let the superintendent know so that information could be disseminated to the students that it was no longer an area where parking was permitted. The Chief of Police knows about it as well. If there is no improvement to the situation please let us know.

Cliff Kuhlmeier- I have a 9 & 4 year old and around 2-3 pm I can't let them out in front of the house because these kids are literally drifting around the corner and I have sat in the middle of the street and stopped them all and asked them kindly please I have kids here and if you hit one of them you are going to kill them. It is 25 mph and they curse me out, they went twice as fast the next day. They do anything they can to aggravate the situation. I have stopped cops to try and tell them this they did a little bit here and there. If you guys are going to put these signs up I commend you, I truly do because it is probably going to save a life.

### **Citizens Hearing:**

Charles Hoffman- With the expansion of our police force have we designated a Traffic Safety Officer?

Committeeman Sachs- Most of these ordinances were recommended by the Chief of Police.

Administrator Pino- Most of these changes are due to the road detours and a lot of the traffic that streets are starting to see that they don't normally didn't see.

Chief Broderick- We have Lieutenant Scott Mura which part of his duties is traffic safety.

Steve Dalton- I have a question with reference to the ordinance regarding Thru Streets and removal of Fleetwood Drive as a thru street. Can you give an explanation of what that means to have a street removed as a thru street?

Chief Broderick- A thru street designation according to the state allows you to designate a street as a thru street and every intersection of that street automatically becomes a stop sign intersection and you don't need a separate ordinance to put a stop sign at every intersection. Every intersection street on Fleetwood Drive has a stop sign there is not a separate ordinance covering every stop sign. By designating Fleetwood Drive as a thru street we are allowed to put stop signs at every intersection.

Mr. Dalton- In addition to the stop signs that are there now. So I assume the intention of the ordinance is to add stop signs on Fleetwood Drive.

Mayor DiNardo- Yes.

George Duncan-Will what I say be reflected in the minutes?

Evelyn Grandi- Yes.

Mr. Duncan- I just want to inform a letter that I sent to Mr. Pino and it is about an ongoing problem I have had. I live at the intersection of Bethany Road and Hazlet Avenue and I live right behind the strip mall. There has been a problem with garbage removal and waste and cardboard. It got pretty bad and I wrote to Mr. Pino and I will supply pictures and I do have video of what

happened there and I will give them to Committee if you want that also. Recently the county health department was there and they have put 3 new dumpsters in there. There is a problem with cooking oil and grease that is spilling onto the ground and there are containers there and they have been there for a while. It is spilling onto the pavement and running onto the property in back of stores. It is coming towards my property. That is not resolved. Due to the nature of this and this has gone on for so long and my mother had the house before me and she has had problems to with the owners there. I would like some due diligence on the part of the Committee as far as getting this issue resolved.

Mayor DiNardo- I can tell you we had the code official out there and I was told that the garbage company that was cleaning everything up for whatever reason went out of business that was taking their recycling and garbage and they did bring new dumpsters in. As far as the cooking oil we will send them back out tomorrow and get this taken care of. I will go back out there tomorrow and take another look at it. I know they were out there and they said it was getting resolved but if there are still more issues we will get them out tomorrow morning.

Mr. Duncan- The container is out there but I know there is still some trash outside the containers.

Mayor DiNardo- We will take care of it tomorrow morning.

Mr. Duncan- What about the oil?

Mayor DiNardo-I have it written down so they can check it out. It should be removed on a regular basis that is how most restaurants work.

Administrator Pino- I did receive your letter today. We have known about it and it has been a continuous problem.

Mayor DiNardo- We will be there tomorrow and I am sorry for the inconvenience.

Bill Shewan- I would like to cover two items that were part of the resolutions #251 Supporting the Bill 2108 and Senate Bill 1041 having to do with Hydraulic Fracturing. As a member of the Hazlet Area Quality of Life I will support this 110% and I am pleased that this was passed. It also does cover waste water that any fracking material that is brought into the State (brought in from PA) will no longer be processed through the sewer authorities in this state. Another point I also support is resolution #255 which is Support of the New Jersey Wildlife Action Plan and I could say our townships stewardship towards NATCO comes into play here. Not many people realize the wildlife that is in there. At least 3 weeks ago I spotted a Fox with the kids in the park and there has been an Eagle that has been in there, not nesting, but it stopped by. I have photographs of the Eagle. Those two items I whole heartedly support. Thank you.

Mayor DiNardo – Bill for the fracking this is all done with the Bayshore Mayors are getting together and Monmouth and Ocean County has been included.

Maureen Miller- I am here tonight to say another great season at the pool club is done and I'll miss it. I wanted to go over a few things to make sure of the success of the pool club next year. I know that this year when a lot of the new things came about they were planned in October and they start way before the season begins. A quick reminder the tennis courts, playground for the children where they play with the sand, I hope new equipment is going in there. One of the main

complaints with the parents with children about ball playing. Since I have been there since the beginning ball playing has always been behind the tennis courts. If they got away with playing on the grass it was because it wasn't a busy day and no one complained. Unfortunately now everyone loves to complain and they want to make sure everyone is aware of everything. Since the beginning of August you had quite a few people come in and say things about the tennis courts with the balls. Those parents have told their kids to play ball down there. One of the things maybe you put sod down there. Lifeguards did a fantastic job. It was a tough month August a lot of things happened and a lot of things were going on. Thank goodness for the people of the township, the police officers and lifeguards everyone working together hopefully that situation is solved. One thing that happened this month which was unfortunate for all the members of the pool club was the opening of daily passes. It was opened for 2 weeks in August. I know you were looking to make money and have people see the place, I think that is what you were doing. I thought to myself people when you go someplace look for the end of the season it is a quiet time. People are going back to school and they are starting to have their parties coming together as a family and that was disrupted this year. Again, did it bring in some people, sure it did. We had one really terrible day that a lot of negative comments were made. My suggestion and I hope you take this to heart is you are looking to have people come in and see how beautiful it is, my suggestion is not to do it at the last week or the last two weeks of the pool club wherein people have paid the higher prices to come. Do it at the end of July so they can join for the month of August if they love it so much and there is where they want to be. My feeling is people will come at the end of August and say they will think about it and next year comes and it never happens. We could have had that membership in August if they enjoyed it so much. I do hope that is taken into consideration for our members. How is the splash park going?

Mayor DiNardo- We just had the engineer into survey it that is as far as we have gone.

Ms. Miller- The people of Hazlet will be notified?

Attorney Cucchiaro- There is no decision to construct the splash park all that was that the township let CME go forward for survey and investigate feasibility at that site. There has to be another vote to move forward to approve splash park.

Ms. Miller- Mr. Pino I was in last week and very disgusted on a Wednesday. I wanted to thank you and let them know you took the time to speak with me. I hope a lot of my suggestions you took to heart. I am willing to work with you because I am a member that does use the pool club almost every day and I do see a lot. We want to make it better not only for the surrounding areas that use it but for the people of Hazlet. I hope that you do consider what the cost will be next year and we can come up with some creative ideas. Thank you.

Charles Hoffman- The gentleman brought up problems with the garbage behind that strip mall. As you know, we have had problems with Airport Plaza off and on. Is there some way for the town Committee to address the business community about undertaken some kind of comprehensive anti-liter campaign especially those establishments that are providing food and drink. As you know Poole Avenue has been cleaned up over the last year or so but before that it was atrocious.

Committeewoman Ronchetti- The Hazlet Business Owners meet the second Wednesday of every month in Airport Plaza on the second floor. There are about 300 business owners. Usually one of

us does try to get there. Maybe we can ask them at their next meeting and it is open to the public down over IEI section. It is at 7PM.

Antoinette Guarino- I never got a response from when I asked about the rubber smell. I stopped smoking a long time ago and I sit there every day and smell that smell.

Administrator Pino- That is standard material for construction at a playground.

Ms. Guarino- I would like to have something in writing.

Administrator Pino- That is not coming from us because we don't have any of that.

Ms. Guarino- It has to come from someone to show me that is not going to harm me. The last two weeks was like a circus at our pool. I don't know who said they can have anyone come in. We have been there a long time and we know our pool, we know our people and if we bring in guests we know our guests. When you bring in rift raft we don't know that guest. We pick up their garbage and all the junk they leave around. I like a clean pool and all the years I have been going there it has been spotless and that is what I want to see next year. Don't bring in the rift raft because a lot of people are saying they are leaving.

Mayor DiNardo- We caught one person and it was a regular member.

Ms. Guarino- Please do not do that again next year.

Eric Toth- I have some questions about the red light cameras and if they are authorized local?

Mayor DiNardo- We don't have red light cameras in Hazlet.

Mr. Toth- Are they authorized locally or by State?

Committeeman Aagre- That is state highway.

Steve Dalton- The Clean Communities Program is that still ongoing in Hazlet?

Mayor DiNardo- We have scheduled clean ups already with HUSA. They now have a key advocate that I deal directly with.

Bill Shewan- I think you should elaborate with regard to motions or resolutions. The one authorizing the township to assess municipal lien on municipal properties. I was not here but I did read prior minutes where you had a citizen come up and complain that the township should take care of cutting lawns where properties are in disarray and from what I understand resolution #246 is just for that. It is for cleaning the properties up and keep them in good order so that the township presents itself as a township that should be not in disarray.

Administrator Pino- After a Notice of Violation is issued and an owner fails to obey the situation then we may go in and do the cleanup.

Gerard McKeever- I live on Fleetwood Drive and I was here a few months ago with the ordinance for the stipulation of the township to unload trucks between 6am-10pm and we went through all that. Costco to me did not pay attention to that. They have unloaded trucks before 5 am. They are also not supposed to drive on the western side of the building and they do it all the time. They are not supposed to unload a truck after 10pm but they are not supposed to receive a truck after 9pm.

Jeff Dispenza – Good evening. I saw on the website about the 4-way stop signs being implemented and I just wanted to clarify the streets it was going to affect because I live on the corner.

Chief Broderick- Roland and Lynn Blvd.

Attorney Cucchiaro- We can answer some superficial questions but we are not allowed to take information until we have the public hearing. It is a 2-step process which the law requires we have to do a first reading which lets everyone know the ordinance is being introduced and then we have the public hearing on the 16<sup>th</sup> of September. At that time we will open it to the public.

Mr. Dispenza- My main concerns are the traffic patterns with the stop and go and the noise.
