Citizens Hearing:

Maureen Miller- This past Thursday I went to the Recreation meeting. They brought up getting new chairs, I mentioned the playground and I believe they said nothing was being done with the playground this year, I just wanted to confirm that. The other thing they said they looked into was possibly getting rid of the sand and putting the tires there. I said the sand is definitely a draw for the kids and they were possibly looking to putting a shower back in which there was originally a shower there. Someone drove by the swim club and there was tree gone and so I asked was it from bad weather and they said someone took it out.

Administrator Pino- We did.

Ms. Miller- The trees when they were planted there many years ago it was planted there for the people of the swim club for beautification plus shade. That tree has been used by people everyday there was a time when people would get to the pool club quick so they can get under their tree. Very sad to hear that a tree was removed for the reasoning that there is a stage going to be stored in the swim club and that is why the tree had to come down. There are plenty of places in the swim club where that can be put.

Administrator Pino- The stage we only had one spot in that swim club which we could actually maneuver it into without destroying the sprinkler systems, the grass, etc. The theory behind the stage is it has wheels and it will be mobile and it is going to be parked generally against that fence line where the tree unfortunately was taking down because of the size of the truck and because it is a big stage. There was no other spot in the place we could of put it. Here is why it is going to be there. That will be used every other day or every few days there will be a different act or magician or whatever it is we do for kids in that section which is basically unused for a good portion of the day. We know people sit under the trees we also have at least 15 or so trees going back in at spring time. We are putting new trees in place including the ones we lost, it was a good tree unfortunately there was just nowhere else we could do it. It is visible that we can always see it and the majority of the people in the club can view whatever is going on.

Ms. Miller- You are going to be keeping it at the swim club and you are saying every three days it is going to be used?

Administrator Pino- There is a schedule of events that is going to happen over the year.

Ms. Miller- Noone thought that this was going to be an eyesore?

Administrator Pino- It is not an eye sore it is a very nice piece of equipment that most towns around the state are jealous of what we have. Getting back to the shower. We looked into that a bit and the one problem is that shower never had was a drain that connected to a sewer system. We can't just put a shower that drains to nowhere nowadays with all the new rules for storm water and everything else. To run a sewer to that spot it is not going to happen this year. We did look into replacing the sand with rubber as requested. The costs were insane it was close to \$20,000.00, which again not worth it.

Ms. Miller- You looked into these things and you are saying they can't work and that is the answer. I heard tonight and it sounds very exciting is the pool slide and flume. Is that something that we are allowed to know how much it costs?

Administrator Pino-We are going out to bid and based upon who bids and what product they submit to us.

Ms. Miller- I heard a Pickle Ball was being introduced this year on the tennis courts?

Administrator Pino- Yes one court.

Ms. Miller- Which is the fourth one?

Administrator Pino- The furthest one closest to the back area you are talking about.

Ms. Miller- O.K. which again something new and exciting I did look into it myself and again it is my opinion and as of right now I will keep it to myself. The Pickle Ball is going to be on the fourth court and because this is very new to the area, it is equipment that they are going to supply to the people of the pool club, with the whiffle ball, so I was wondering if they would be supplying tennis racquets? I am saying for the children not the adults.

Administrator Pino- The Racquets for Pickle Ball or Tennis?

Ms. Miller- I am saying both now.

Administrator Pino- Not a bad idea to supply the tennis racquets but as far as Pickle Ball nothing there is permanent we are putting the paint down ourselves and the lines ourselves and we have quotes coming in to fix all the cracks. The nets for the Pickle Ball are not permanent they can be moved. If we had someone that wanted to use the forth tennis court we can simply move them to the side and they can play tennis.

Ms. Miller- I thought once we brought the pool club back to life we were going to revisit the prices for the people of Hazlet so that the cost could hopefully be adjusted. One of the age groups I am talking about is 18-61 for one individual. I don't know if anything can be done I do know the print is out and I do know we are having an open house in May and I was wondering if
