### **Citizens Hearing:**

Harry Creuz- I was here a few months ago complaining about the no turn signs at S. Laurel Avenue and Marsand Drive and I was told there would be inquiries with the Chief of Police and was hoping this would be resolved by now and what the results were?

Mayor Aagre- The signs were being made.

Mr. Creuz- The signs were up for about one month and then taken down.

Mayor Aagre- Since the last time you were here we have requested DPW to make new signs so that they can put them back up. I believe they were going to put a No-thru Traffic between 10-12. I will find the status out about that.

Mr. Creuz- Between 10-12 in the morning or at night?

Mayor Aagre- I forget the times but I know there was a restriction.

Mr. Creuz- The heaviest traffic is between 6:30 am-10am and between 2pm-4pm.

Mayor Aagre- I will find out what the status is and what the restrictions are. We will follow up on that and if you have any questions please feel free to call Mr. Pino.

Maureen Miller- If I heard him correct that is the sign about a year ago that they say that they were going to put up that people could not cut through Marsand Drive? This is probably already a done deal but were there any accidents or anything ever caused on Marsand Drive. I lived there all my life so I am just asking?

Mayor Aagre- The concern the gentleman brought up originally was the speed the people cutting through that street between Laurel Avenue to get onto Middle Road with small children in the area.

Committeeman Sachs- The traffic light on Middle Road and Laurel Avenue belongs to Holmdel it is not the county. The timing is off on that light and what was happening was it was causing traffic to back up on Laurel Avenue because the signage was up. Holmdel was supposed to investigate it and get back to us and retime the light which they haven't done. The chief's concern at that time was an accident someone coming over the hill with the backup of the traffic. Until they get the traffic light rectified and more time for people to move out of that intersection, once they get that rectified those signs will go back up again to stop the traffic flow through Marsand.

Ms. Miller- What is probably going to happen is the street before Marsand Drive is going to come in next that is what is going to happen after all this people are going to come in and say now they are coming down my street. As I say living here 51 years I have been using that street Marsand Drive and I have never heard of an accident or seen an accident there and I hope that this doesn't cause an accident on Laurel Avenue.

Mayor Aagre- We are working with Holmdel to get the light signal correct.

Ms. Miller- I was at the fireworks last night and it was a fabulous night in Hazlet. RAGE was there and everyone signed the petition at the swim club. I applaud those women for being there last night. Love the pool club it looks great I still am here because a lot of people are using the pool club tennis courts. Today we had the coach from Raritan and some girls give brief free lessons to anyone who wanted them. The last time I was here I mentioned about the courts they weren't done and you said you were getting bids, I am here for the update.

Administrator Pino- We did and they started the work on the Hockey Rink first then they are heading over to the swim club.

Ms. Miller- When will the tennis courts be done?

Administrator Pino- I imagine within the next week or two I can find out.

Mayor Aagre- The guys are here on site so when they finish the hockey rink they will be at the tennis courts.

Harry Creuz- A car drove into the house at 1 Marsand Drive taking a turn off Laurel Avenue, a car came down Laurel Avenue and side swiped a car at number 10 and a lady was killed at the corner of Marsand and Azee Drive. There are accidents on that road.

Charles Hoffman- The population of this community is about 20,000 correct?

Mayor Aagre- Yes sir.

Mr. Hoffman- You folks are responsible for their safety and well-being may I ask what has happened to something that I believe was in the legislature maybe about 1-2 ½ years ago generators for shore area gas stations what is the story?

Administrator Pino- It was a state enacted measure but I haven't seen much with gas stations coming in for generator permits. It may be for new gas stations or transitions, I can find out and let you know.

Mayor Hoffman- What is the qualifying guideline who can participate in the small business tax payer reduction? Is it like \$1million a year. Hazlet Pharmacy would be able to participate right?

Deputy Mayor Kiley- Are you talking about Shop Hazlet, Hazlet Pharmacy has already signed up.

Mr. Hoffman- CVS can't because they are a large chain?

Deputy Mayor Kiley- It is not whether you can or you can't it is whether you would want to or not want to. If you are a big corporate organization like CVS those decisions are made much higher up then those that are privately owned.

Mr. Hoffman- There was some type of a big settlement in NY State and also an adjunct to a federal settlement here last week. NY State got about \$240 Million out of it. I think \$47 million dollars of that settlement was going to be directed towards the retirement of older trucks. I guess because before 1990 when the EPA started going with tier 1,2 or 3 and if you had a truck before that they would subsidize you to a certain extent for buying a replacement truck this is decent for the independent guy vs. the corporate guy. Is there anything in this state about that I know they have been struggling to try and get something done? Should the township be writing a letter to the DEP because an awful lot of your population works in that area?

Deputy Mayor Kiley- I would love to see that study.

Mr. Hoffman- I would like to thank you public works department via Mr. Pino everytime I give him something I think needs to be done it gets done in a relatively short order.

Thomas Wolf- I live on 2 Miriam Place and the reason I am here is basically for my own knowledge and I hope I don't offend you by beating the same subject to death. It has to do with Marsand Drive and my question for you is there an ordinance for a stop sign to be placed at the intersection of Marsand and Azee Drive?

Administrator Pino- I could find out we would have to check, we don't have that information here.

Mr. Wolf- I moved into Hazlet in 1990 and since then every person I know that lives either on Miriam or I have spoken with has all been in the same situation where when you come in from Middle Road and approach Marsand and people do not stop because there is not a stop sign. If you go to Gerald Terrace there is not a stop sign but there is a white mark that leads across the front of it. Gerald Terrace is not the problem it is really Marsand because people use it as a cut through. At least 3 or 4 times a month I am nearly blasted at that corner because I am going straight up Azee and someone is coming up Marsand and the problem is they don't stop. Is there any way to find out to have a stop sign there and please let me know?

Administrator Pino- Leave your name and number with me I will get back to you.
