Year-Round service is available at our convenient Household Hazardous Waste facility in Tinton Falls. For your safety, appointments are required. Please call 732-683-8686 for information. Hours are Monday to Friday 7:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. and Saturday 7:30 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. (Closed for lunch 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.)

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Pesticides, Herbicides, Fertilizers, Solvents, Thinners, Corrosives, Cleaners, Pool Chemicals, Oil paints, Varnishes, Aerosol Cans (Full or partially full), Used Motor Oil, Anti-Freeze, Gasoline, Automotive and 'Button' Batteries, and Propane BBQ Tanks. All items must be in closed containers with original labels. Maximum amount accepted is 200lbs. of dry material and/or 20gals. of liquid. No containers larger than 5gals. each.

NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Lab Reagents, Concrete, Electronics, Car Tires, Explosives, Radioactive Materials, and Asbestos. No unknown or unidentified materials allowed! No commercial or industrial contributors! Businesses must contract privately for proper disposal. Latex paint is no longer accepted at these events!

LATEX PAINT IS NOT A HAZARDOUS WASTE

It should be dried out with paint hardener (available at home improvement stores) or absorbent such as cat litter, sawdust or dirt. Dried paint and empty cans can be disposed with your regular household trash - leave the lid off so your trash collector knows there is no liquid. It costs the county more than \$6.00 per gallon to dispose liquid paints that were being brought to these events!
