Year-Round service is available at our convenient Household Hazardous Waste facility in Tinton Falls. For your safety, appointments are required. Please call 732-922-2234 for information. Hours are Monday to Friday 7:30am - 3:30pm and Saturday 7:30am - 2:00pm. (Closed for lunch 11:30am - 12:30pm)

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Pesticides, Herbicides, Fertilizers, Solvents, Thinners, Corrosives, Cleaners, Pool Chemicals, Liquid paints, Varnishes, Aerosol Cans (Full or partially full), Used Motor Oil, Anti-Freeze, Gasoline, Automotive and 'Button' Batteries, and Propane BBQ Tanks. All items must be in closed containers with original labels. Maximum amount accepted is 200lbs. of dry material and/or 20gals. of liquid. No containers larger than 5gals. each.

NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Lab Reagents, Concrete, Electronics, Car Tires, Explosives, Radioactive Materials, and Asbestos. No unknown or unidentified materials allowed! No commercial or industrial contributors! Businesses must contract privately for proper disposal.

LATEX PAINT OPTIONS

If you live in the town of Aberdeen, Atlantic Highlands, Belmar, Deal, Eatontown, Freehold Township, Highlands or Neptune, you can take your Latex Paint to your town's recycling center. Call your town for details. Oil based paint and chemicals cannot be taken to these municipal sites; you must use the county site in Tinton Falls or come to these single-day events.

Latex paint can also be solidified with dirt, cat litter or another absorbent. Dried paint and empty cans should be disposed of in your household trash.
